Get ready for the fall cold and flu season!

Vaccines are the (second) easiest way to protect ourselves from serious complications from infections aside from washing our hands, but it can be confusing to know what vaccines you're eligible for! This simple guide can help you.



Influenza (flu)

- WHAT does this protect you against?
 - · The most common strains of the flu virus that are forecast for each year
- WHO can get this vaccine?
 - Anyone over the age of 6 mos
 - o Children under 9 yrs getting the vaccine for the first time need 2 doses at least 4 wks apart!
- WHEN can you get the vaccine?
 - Starting October 20, 2025
- WHERE can you get the vaccine?
 - o AHS immunization clinics for families of children 6 mos 5 yrs
 - Pharmacies 5 yrs and older
 - o At any Public Health Clinic on-Reserve
- Is the vaccine **FREE**?
 - Yes! Free to ALL Albertans!





- WHAT does this protect you against?
 - The current "LP.8.1" vaccines provide protection against the most recent strains of COVID-19
- WHO can get this vaccine?
 - Anyone over the age of 6 mos
 - Anyone getting the vaccine for the first time will need <u>2 doses</u> at least <u>4 wks</u> apart!
- WHEN can you get the vaccine?
 - Starting October 1, 2025 for high-risk individuals
 - Starting <u>October 20, 2025</u> for all other individuals
- WHERE can you get the vaccine?
 - At any Public Health Clinic on-Reserve will be offered to Indigenous people without charge according to the ISC
 - Other locations are available call <u>811</u>
- Is the vaccine FREE?
 - Free to MANY Albertans: Pregnant people, and those with chronic illnesses and disabilities (this list is broad and you do not need to provide proof); \$100 administrative fee for others



Pneumococcal (PNEU-C)

- WHAT does this protect you against?
 - The bacteria Streptococcus pneumoniae that cause pneumococcal disease lung, airway, blood, and middle-ear infections, as well as meningitis
 - **WHO** should get this vaccine?
 - Children <u>under the age of 5</u>
 - o <u>Indigenous</u> people
 - Adults over the age of 65
 - <u>Immunocompromised</u> individuals
 - WHEN can you get the vaccine?
 - Available <u>year-round</u> with appointment
- WHERE can you get the vaccine?
 - At any Public Health Clinic or Community Health Centre by appointment

(AIVCC)

- At any Public Health Clinic on-Reserve Is the vaccine FREE?
- - Free to eligible Albertans




Respiratory Syncytial Virus (RSV)

- WHAT does this protect you against?
 - A common infection that affects the lungs and airways in the late fall and spring,
 and can be serious in very young and older people
- WHO should get this vaccine?
 - o Adults over the age of 70
 - Adults over the age of 60 who are <u>Indigenous</u> or live in a <u>supportive living home</u>
- WHEN can you get the vaccine?
 - Available <u>year-round</u> with appointment
- WHERE can you get the vaccine?
 - o At any Public Health Clinic or Community Health Centre by appointment
 - o At any Public Health Clinic on-Reserve
 - Some pharmacies also offer walk-in RSV vaccines
- Is the vaccine **FREE**?
 - Free to eligible Albertans



- WHAT does this protect you against?
- The <u>measles virus</u>, which is currently being actively transmitted in Alberta (bundled with mumps and rubella vaccine)
- WHO can get this vaccine?
 - Anyone over the age of 12 mos born after 1970
 - Must not have had blood products in last 11 mos
 - Must not have had another live vaccine in last 3 mos
 - Must not be pregnant
- WHEN can you get the vaccine?
 - Available **year-round** with appointment
- WHERE can you get the vaccine?
 - o At any Public Health Clinic or Community Health Centre by appointment
 - o At any Public Health Clinic on-Reserve
- Is the vaccine FREE?
- Free to eligible Albertans



Remember: the easiest way to prevent infection is to wash your hands!

Washing your hands with warm, soapy water for at least 2<u>0 seconds</u> (about as long as it takes to sing "Happy Birthday" twice) is the best way to make sure that you don't spread germs!
